Florence Nightingale-

Is also known as 'The Lady With The Lamp.'
She was born in Florence in Italy on 12th May 1820 and died in England in 1910. She was put in charge of nursing British and allied soldiers in Turkey during the Crimean War. Her work led to developments in nursing that impact today.

Mary Seacole-

Was born in Jamaica in 1805 and died in 1881 in London. She was a business woman who cared for British soldiers during the Crimean War.

Edith Cavell-

Was born on the 4th December 1865 in England. She was an English nurse who became a popular heroine in WW1. She was executed in Belgium in 1915 for assisting allied soldiers escape from German occupied Belgium.
